
Honey Plushie Pattern

Note that in order to maximize the scale on an 8.5 by 11 inch sheet of paper, I've included no seam allowance here. Add as appropriate to your chosen fabric (I'm using felt).





X1 - Back Panel




Machine sew the ear sides together and invert them. Fold forward and hand stitch.





Layer first the front panel, then the ears (pointing in with their backs facing forward), then the back panel. Hand stitch together at the ears.

Add more stuffing, as necessary.



Invert the feet. Add stuffing to the cups this creates, then hand stitch the foot pads on to the underside of the feet. Hand stitch the toes.






Hand Stitch the two muzzle panels together at the sides, but not the front.


Machine sew the front and back panels together. Invert through the back of the head slit (I put a few temporary stitches at the top and bottom to prevent it from stretching out too much).

Stuff the head from the back, then position the eyes. Unstuff the head and attach the eyes.




Stuff the body. Pin the back of the head slit, bend the head slightly forward over the neck slit and hand stitch together.


Machine sew the tail together, stuff it, and hand stitch it on ~.5in/1.5cm above the leg separation in back




Hand stitch on the muzzle with the longer panel on top. Stuff it and pin the mouth at the center. Crease the upper panel on either side, folding out to create the nostrils.



Hand stitch along the mouth, securing the nostril folds. Cinch across the mouth from each corner, separating the lips, and between the nostrils internally.



Cinch the corners of the eyes.



Hand stitch loosely through the stuffing at the creases of the hip and arm. At the hip, angle back towards the midline below the tail. At the arms, angle out and down so that the separation of the arms starts lower in the back, and the upper back is broader than the chest.
